Protest against privatization of hospital surgeries at Premiers' conference

Hundreds, including many from CUPE's hospital locals, protested outside the meeting of the Prime Minister and Canada's premier's in Huntsville on July 22.

The protest, organized by the Ontario Health Coalition, was against the privatization of hospital surgeries. Ontario plans to privatize up to 50% of hospital surgeries. Private surgeries are 2x as expensive as those done in public hospitals and studies have shown that private surgeries give the wealthy much greater access to them and everyone else, less.



Perth & Smith's Falls **Activist and National Staff Representative Doreen Beath Passes**

CUPF National staff representative and longtime CUPE Local 2119 president, Doreen Beath has died. Doreen also served as an alternate Vicepresident of the Ontario Council of Hospital Unions-CUPE.

When the Perth and Smith's Falls hospitals merged, plans were made to transfer some patients from Perth to Smith's Falls. The two communities are not served by public transit. Doreen warned that some of the seniors would die if transferred. The hospital fired her. She worked on OCHU-CUPE campaigns until she was reinstated by the Labour Relations Board.

Seniors did die in that transfer, as it turned out.

She was a great activist.

Major Study on Nurse to **Patient Ratios in August**

OCHU-CUPE has commissioned a major study of nurse to patient ratios, which will be released at the Ontario legislature on August 12.

The study looks at the successful introduction of these ratios in other provinces (BC) and in other countries (USA, Australia etc.). Where they have been introduced, patient deaths have fallen and nurse retention has improved significantly.
